Getting started

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Your students can sign up to the Joint Programme on the first day of their ACA training agreement, or simply join partway through, providing they meet the following requirements:

- ACA students must not have completed the Professional Level Business Planning module;
- CTA students must not have completed the two CTA Advanced Technical Papers;
- Students do not need to have any tax knowledge or experience to start the Joint Programme, but must have ongoing taxation work experience to be able to complete the Joint Programme.
